We Can Influence and Change Society

Christians are fundamentally different from non-Christians. Christians must penetrate or permeate non-Christian society. Christians can influence and change society. It's often said that they can't, and I'm an increasingly strong enemy of a pessimism that says there is nothing we can do to change society. We can. We can make it a great deal more pleasing to God. I want to suggest to you that the metaphors Jesus used definitely teach this. Just as salt rubbed into or soaked into the meat and fish can actually arrest or hinder the process of decay, so Christians can act as salt and hinder social decay. They can hinder the degenerative processes of human society. Just as light shining into darkness dispels the darkness, so Christians can act as light, and they can dispel the darkness of evil and sorrow from the community with the Good News of Jesus Christ. You know what your own country is like. I'm a visitor, and I wouldn't presume to speak about America. But I know what Great Britain is like. I know something about the growing dishonesty, corruption, immorality, violence, pornography, the diminishing respect for human life, and the increase in abortion.

Whose fault is it? Let me put it like this: if the house is dark at night, there is no sense in blaming the house. That's what happens when the sun goes down. The question to ask is, "Where is the light?" "If meat goes bad, there is no sense in blaming the meat. That is what happens when the bacteria are allowed to breed unchecked. The question to ask is, "Where is the salt?" If society becomes corrupt like a dark night or stinking fish, there's no sense in blaming society. That's what happens when fallen human society is left to itself and human evil is unrestrained and unchecked. The question to ask is "Where is the church?" Why is the church not having a greater influence on society, hindering decay and spreading the light? Let's ascribe the blame where the blame is due. It's entirely hypocritical of us to shrug our shoulders and raise our eyebrows, wring our hands in despair, and blame society for going bad. Jesus told us to be the world's salt and light. If darkness and rottenness abound, then it's our fault, and we have to accept the blame. Further we must accept with new determination the role that Jesus has given us. Again I say, there is too much pessimism abroad in the Christian church today. Don't you believe that the gospel of Christ is the power of God unto salvation? Don't you believe that human beings can be changed? Don't you believe that human society can be changed? Of course it can. There are many historical examples of the benefits that Christ has brought to society through his devoted and uncompromising followers.

Let me quote from the end of Kenneth Latourette's seven volume history of the expansion of Christianity. Referring to Jesus he says, "No life ever lived on this planet has been so influential in the affairs of men as that of Christ. From that brief life, and its apparent frustration, has flowed a more powerful force for the triumphal waging of man's long battle than any other ever known by the human race. "Through it, millions of people have had their inner conflicts resolved. Through it, hundreds of millions have been lifted from illiteracy and ignorance and have been placed upon the road of growing intellectual freedom and control over the physical environment. It has done more to allay the physical ills of disease and famine than any other impulse, and it has emancipated millions from chattel slavery and millions of others from thralldom to vice. It has protected tens of millions from exploitation by their fellows, and it has been the most fruitful source of movements to lessen the horrors of war and to put the relations of men and nations on the basis of justice and peace." This is the influence of Jesus through his followers in society. Don't underestimate the power and the influence that even a small minority can exert in the community.

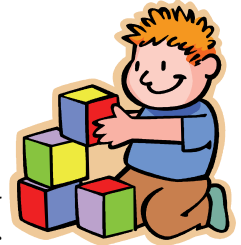

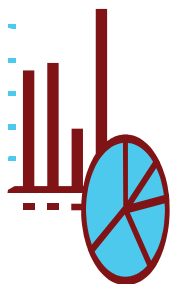

WHAT ARE “WE” TEACHING OUR KIDS? OR “THERE’S AN APP FOR THAT!”

The opening paragraph of an article I recently read goes like this: “In a random fourth grade class not too long ago, the teacher recited that week’s verse with the kids. But only a few were repeating the verse with him. Finally, one boy raised his hand. Voicing what all the kids were really thinking, the boy asked, ‘So, why are we memorizing this verse? Can’t we just look it up online whenever we want to?’ “ Now that’s a great question!

So, why when the Bible is at the touch of our fingertips on our Blackberry or iPod do we need to have our children learn to look up verses in the Bible, or read God’s Word from the printed page, or memorize Bible verses? Why can’t we just show a few Veggie Tale movies or stream the “Ten Commandments” for an evenings entertainment? Here’s why!

1. Hiding God’s Word in our hearts is transforming. Knowing God’s Word is life transformation and is less about information recall and more about being engaged by and immersed in the Word of God. “All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach us what’s true and to make us realize what’s wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we’re wrong and teaches us to do what’s right.” 1 Timothy 3:16

2. We want our children to be children of “The Book.” Why? Because we want our children to be transformed by God. It’s imperative they know the Book that tells them who God is, who Jesus is, and who the Holy Spirit is. How else in this fast-paced global community will our kids understand the one True God and learn to share Him as Truth?

3. Kids need to reflect on Scripture passages allowing the Holy Spirit to reveal Himself. Kids need to internalize God’s Word. God’s Word is ALIVE and our kids need to learn how to LIVE it. The creator of Veggie Tales, Phil Vischer has a new video resource for kids called *What’s in the Bible*, which walks kids through each book of the Bible, highlighting major themes of each book and how they all connect. And even though Vischer uses the latest technology, he doesn’t believe cool technology is the solution for Bible literacy. He says, “I don’t think the verse says, ‘Thy Word have I hid in my iPad.’ “Until kids have a memory card slot in their heads, this means they need to internalize God’s Word the old fashioned way—by learning it.”

Do I think there is a place for Bible apps, videos, streaming and all that technology can bring? Of course! Whether the Bible is printed or it’s an app on the phone in my pocket, it is still God’s living, breathing Word! It’s ALIVE and our kids need to learn it and LIVE it. We’ll be helping your kids do just that this year in all of our Kidz Connection activities We’ll give them space and freedom to explore God’s Word and practice faith skills that bring them closer to God. I pray, that as parents of His Kids, this will be a priority in your home this year, too!

TALKING ABOUT 9/11

Every year, the attacks of 9/11 recede further into the past. However, for those of us who lost someone close or otherwise experienced the day—whether in person or on television—thinking and talking about 9/11 may still evoke strong emotions that transport us back to the tragedy and can jar emotions long forgotten. How can we talk to our children about what they will see and hear in the coming weeks without evoking fear and anxiety. Here are a few simple tips:

Listen: Some children will want to talk about the attacks and others won't. Both reactions are common and normal. If they do want to talk, it's important to offer children a safe space to share memories, beliefs and questions. If they don't want to talk, don't force the discussions. Continue to check in and let them know your available if they would like to talk.

Don't avoid difficult conversations: It is the attacks themselves that are upsetting, not the conversations about them. Invite the conversation with open-ended questions such as "What would you like to know about 9/11?" or "Why do you think we are remembering the anniversary of 9/11?" Use age appropriate language and reassure children about their own safety and allowing them to express concerns about 9/11 and its aftermath in more depth.

Be factual: Your child's understanding of 9/11 comes from a myriad of sources—family, school, friends and media—and as is often the case with so many voices, these sources can sometimes contradict one another. It is important to answer with basic facts and point them to reliable sources of information for further research. Be prepared for your child to ask questions about death when discussing 9/11. Be honest and developmentally appropriate.

Be specific: It can be easy to make generalizations when discussing 9/11. As with many tragedies, some have a tendency to talk in broad strokes; for example, comparing the suffering of one person to another or assigned blame to an entire group. The story of 9/11 is actually thousands of individual stories. Highlight those specific stories to help humanize the event, and avoid stereotypes and simplifications.

Monitor the TV and Internet: As we approach the 10th Anniversary of 9/11, television programs and news shows will discuss the attacks and their aftermath in detail. Programs will include footage from 9/11 itself, and include scenes that are not appropriate for children to view at all or without supervision. Similarly, children may use the internet to seek out answers to their questions rather than coming to you. Be actively involved in the quality and amount of information they receive.

Emphasize hope: The attacks of 9/11 showed us the worst in people as well as the best in people. It was a time when many wonderful compassionate and heroic deeds occurred in response to a terrible act by a few people. Help your children recognize how their own compassion and empathy for people is so important. Help them to understand how to treat people of different cultures and beliefs with kindness and respect. Above all, remind them that Jesus Christ came for us all. As Christians, we are safe in His loving arms. Even when bad things happen, He will never leave us. He is with us 24/7 and He was with us on 9/11.

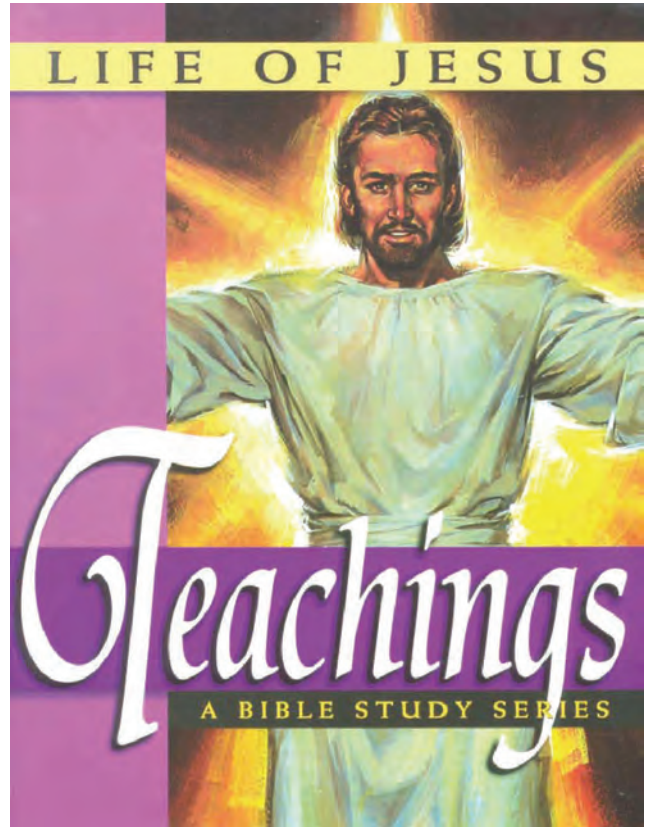

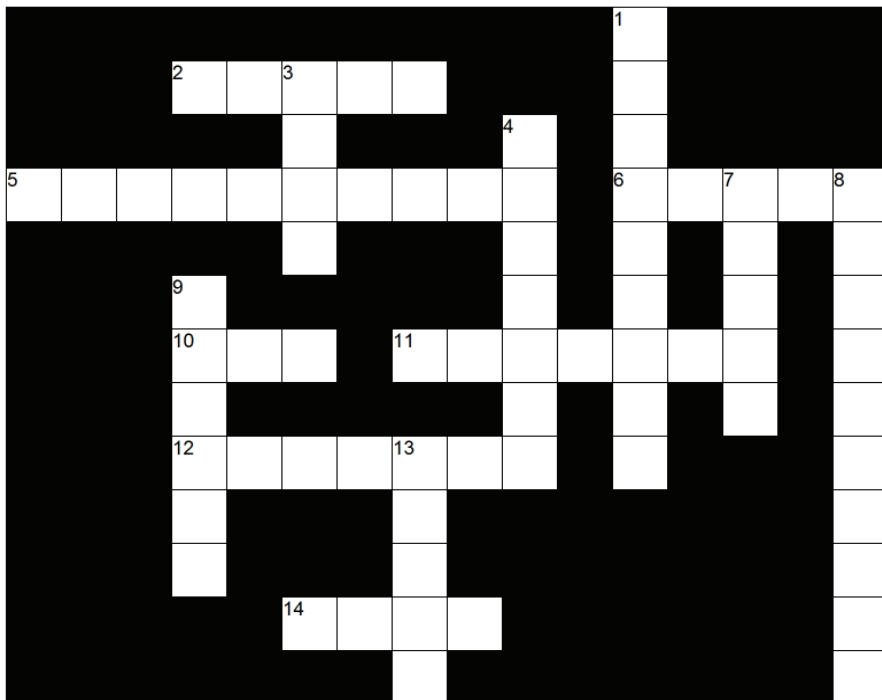
